## Summary of April 21<sup>st</sup> Council Meeting

### Topics discussed

#### Congregational Coaching sessions

- ◆ Next full congregational session is May 1. Pastor Charlotte will help us craft a behavioral covenant.
- ◆ We discussed “What is the vision we have for our church?” as it still not defined. Group thought that maybe a vision of “healing” could help provide new direction. Question arose are we supporting new members and what they want to do?
- ◆ We discussed and decided a quarterly meeting schedule should be re-implemented.

#### Creating a Healthier Church

- ◆ Council continued to read ‘*Creating a Healthier Church*, ’and discussed Chapter 3 *What Unbalances the System?* There was some agreement that our church tends to have a higher level of anxiety. Chapter 4 will be read and discussed for our next meeting.

#### Building & Grounds

- ◆ **Pest Control** – The Pest Control Company will send a contract for two buildings. They ask that their ad be put in the Beacon each month as part of the contract. We agreed to move forward on this. Carol will follow up.
- ◆ **Parsonage Heating** -- Jim followed up with plumber Greg Gauthier about warranty reimbursement for repair. Greg needs to get into parsonage again to research more info. Jim will ask him to call Pastor Carol to move this along. Fran re-sent information to Alain via Jim F. about contacting the installing plumber to seek restitution.
- ◆ **Elevator & Gas Inspections** - Checks went out and were cashed for the inspections.
- ◆ **Lawn Care** - Jim will follow up on a possible lawn care contact, possibly Tim Scanlon. We will likely need to pay more than we have in the past.

#### Income Opportunities

- ◆ Uno’s Fundraiser – All day on April 24<sup>th</sup>. Please share coupons with friends, family, etc.
- ◆ Flea Market April 30<sup>th</sup>. Donations are coming in. All inside and some outside tables are rented. Ads have been placed in multiple newspapers. Ron took paperwork for kitchen license so that we should be all set for another year. He will fill them out.
- ◆ Jim M is still awaiting a response from the cell phone tower contact Pastor Carol provided. However, Chris Williams from Shrewsbury FCC is helping Jim M investigate. This is an important option for us as it could help balance the budget.
- ◆ Fran is awaiting Carol Dearborn’s decision in regards to the Yoga rental opportunity. Hence this topic was not discussed this time.
- ◆ Jim M. and Marie are now responsible for the rental of Fellowship hall. Pastor Carol should be contacted for all weddings and funerals.

#### Sunday School

- ◆ Reviewed Leah’s write up about how this past year had gone. Attendance remains light despite all the hard work put into new curriculum and other changes.

#### Finance

- ◆ **Treasurer Transition**- Cheryl continues to try to streamline the system. Challenging because our version of Quickbooks is strictly an expense sheet system with no balance sheet system or budgeting functions.

- ◆ **Budget Deficit** – 2-1/2 years of funds left if we continue to run a \$24,000/year deficit. There is very little room to cut the budget. The need to raise money is a critical issue, and we'll need to discuss this with the congregation. The Cell tower is critical in lowering our deficit. There has also been some talk about doing the Chicken Barbeque this year. Other fund raising/community outreach ideas are ham and bean suppers with part of funds donated to a community need, Community Garden on front lawn, sell pumpkins. Discussed the need for a Fundraising Committee and an Outreach Committee.
- ◆ **Investment Team/Blackrock transfer** – Overall investment strategy may need to change in light of Chris's suggestion that, based on the church's current financial position, we may want to consider pulling out of the stock market altogether. Chris G., Kathy A., Alain B., Cheryl S., Linda P. are the finance committee and need to look at bylaws to be sure it functions properly. Chris is to schedule a meeting after a Sunday church service. Chris reported that there is still some trustees' and congregational money comingled in the Blackrock account that needs to be separated. He is working on this with Jeri.
- ◆ Cheryl will be on vacation August 14-21.

## **A NOTE FROM CHURCH COUNCIL AND OFFICERS**

Thank you for your interest and participation in the quarterly congregational meeting on May 22.

Following a summary of our current financial position, many good, heartfelt thoughts and ideas were expressed concerning our congregation's ongoing purpose and how or if we want to move forward with the challenging work of church revitalization. It was a difficult discussion, and we very much appreciate the willingness of so many of you to be part of it.

In an ongoing effort to hear from as many voices as possible, we Council members and church officers would like to extend an invitation to church members and friends to meet with us informally in small groups after worship on Sundays over the summer. There will be 2-3 of us available in Fellowship Hall each Sunday, and beverages will be provided. The purpose of these listening sessions is to help us to discern our future direction as a congregation. Questions we all need to be exploring are: What is God calling First Church to be and to do in the 21<sup>st</sup> Century? What are we passionate about? Who are we called to serve? What are the needs of our neighbors? What do we have the energy and the resources to do?

We hope that you will come share with us and that you will hold our congregation and its leadership in your prayers as we seek to guide the church through a challenging time in our history and that of churches in general. The culture has changed around us. How will we respond?

If you have a favorite piece that's not in one of our hymnals, feel free to give that a try as well. We now subscribe to a music licensing service and may still be able to access the music.

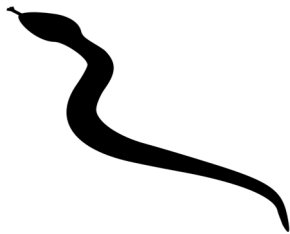
