## From the Pastor

Dear Friends,

In the ancient world, marauding invaders conquered every city at one time or another, except one. The city of Constantinople, known today as Istanbul, never fell to an invading army. Although it was besieged seven times, even surrounded by land and sea for over a year, the city was never forced to surrender. Constantinople survived because there was a cavern beneath it. The cavern had been carved out of rock in about 100 B.C.E.\* When it rained, water flowed into the cavern and provided a supply of fresh water, always available to the city, but invisible to attackers. The city had a constant source of renewal from within.

As we begin our ministry together, I pray that a source of spiritual renewal from within will flow here at First Congregational Church. I am writing this letter after our first service of worship together. At that service I could sense a spirit of deep caring among you: caring for God and caring for one another. Already I have seen members and friends of our church give of their time, talents, and treasure to support our church in our ministry of sharing the good news of God's love for all humanity.

As a church, we will face challenges. But in our faith, we find a limitless source of renewal from within. May we also remember to thank God for what we have in this church: a vibrant community where we can worship God and draw strength from one another.
