Dear Friends,

As I write this, the Center for Disease Control has just made a new recommendation. Because COVID 19 continues to rage around the world, spreading faster in the Delta variant, the CDC recommends that vaccinated people, as well as those who are not vaccinated, once again wear masks indoors in areas with a lot of COVID cases.

I find myself reacting to this recommendation with mixed emotions. Of course I want to do everything I can to stop the spread of this horrible virus. And I know the CDC and other health services are deeply committed to ending the pandemic. Since it's a new disease, nobody knows the best way to fight it. Scientists are learning new things about the virus every day. Sometimes changes have to be made, based on new information.

Still I also have a feeling of what you might call whiplash. For months, I wore a mask wherever masks were recommended. When the vaccine was available, like millions of others, I got the shot. After waiting a couple of weeks for the vaccine to take full effect, I thought it was OK to stop wearing a mask. Now the guidance has changed.

It's difficult to experience these changes, especially when a potentially deadly disease is involved. But life is full of changes. We often feel a sense of whiplash. Sometimes the changes are minor, like having to cancel the picnic because of rain. Sometimes the changes are major, like missing months of work because of an accident, or losing your job altogether.

You and I can go through these changes in the faith that we are blessed by the companionship of Jesus, God's love come to dwell among us. We are blessed that, in the midst of changes, Jesus "is the same yesterday and today and forever" (Hebrews 13: 8). If you're feeling a sense of whiplash, I recommend the following hymn for your reflection. Written by Edward Hopper, it's one of my favorites:

Jesus, Savior, pilot me  
Over life's tempestuous sea;  
Unknown waves before me roll,  
Hiding rock and treacherous shoal;  
Chart and compass come from thee,  
Jesus, Savior, pilot me.

As a mother stills her child,  
Thou canst hush the ocean wild;  
Boisterous waves obey thy will  
When thou sayest to them, "Be Still."  
Wondrous Sovereign of the sea,  
Jesus, Savior, pilot me.

In the midst of life's changes, may you always feel the steady hand of our Savior guiding you.
