#### Dear Friends,

An exhibit at the Tower of London recently displayed an artist's sculpture called "Harness Armour for Birds." The artist was Seamus Moran. His sculpture had been inspired by something he had seen on an earlier visit to the Tower. In an exhibit on medieval armor, Moran was disturbed to see of a suit of armor crafted for a child. Standing among rows of suits of armor for men and horses, this little metal suit got Moran's attention. The armor was probably intended only for ceremonial use, not for warfare. Still, Moran wondered, what sort of world glorifies war and violence so much that it would dress a child in metal so heavy he could barely have been able to move?

Moran's creation, armor for a bird, shows how ridiculous it is to craft protection so heavy it defeats the bird's purpose. Birds are created to fly; the armor weighs them down. As the Rev. Quinn Caldwell puts it, "At what point do you become so self-protected that you can no longer do the thing you were created to do? How much protection do you need? And how much can you bear before you stop being able to grow, or fly?"\*

In his letter to the young church at Rome, the apostle Paul urges those followers of Jesus not to put on the heavy armor of the world, but to put on the armor of light that Jesus provides:

"Let us then lay aside the works of darkness and put on the armor of light; let us live honorably as in the day, not in reveling and drunkenness, not in debauchery and licentiousness, not in quarreling and jealousy. Instead, put on the Lord Jesus Christ" (Romans 13: 12-14).

Quinn Caldwell goes on, "Jesus knew about burdens, the ones the world gives us and the ones we give ourselves. He knew about harnesses, and yokes. Don't put on the heavy armor, he said. Put on the light armor. Don't put on the armor that smells like grease and machines and war. It might protect you, but it will sink you to the ground. Instead, put on the armor that feels like feathers on the wind and smells like the sun on a child's skin. Don't put on the world, he said. Put on me."\*

As fall brings cooler temperatures, we will need to put on coats and jackets to protect us from the cold. But as followers of Jesus, may we lay aside the need to protect ourselves with cumbersome emotional defenses. May trust in God to protect us. May we loosen our grip on the defenses we cling to, and put on the light-as-a-feather armor of light that Jesus provides.
