Dear Friends,

When I taught confirmation class, I would always assign the Gospel of Luke to be read by confirmands and mentors. That's because Luke's gospel is the most readable for today's readers. Luke also gives colorful details about Jesus that make him come to life for people of all ages. This year, the Revised Common Lectionary recommends passages from Luke for pastors to preach on. We'll be reflecting on these during the month of February, as the season of Epiphany continues.

You may remember from your own Christian Education that both Matthew and Luke include a sermon where Jesus sets forth his beliefs about God and the life to which God calls us. Matthew calls this the Sermon on the Mount; for Luke it's the Sermon on the Plain. Another difference between the two is that Matthew gives us only the "blessed are you" proclamations of Jesus, traditionally called the Beatitudes, while Luke gives us proclamations of both "blessed are you" and "woe to you!"

Luke shows us a Jesus who calls us blessed, but also warns us that seeking the approval of others distracts us from serving God. In the spirit of continuing our Christian Education, I offer Luke's blessings and woes, in a fresh translation by Eugene Peterson in *The Message*:

"You're blessed when you've lost it all,  
God's Kingdom is there for the finding.  
You're blessed when you're ravenously hungry,  
Then you're ready for the Messianic\* meal.  
You're blessed when the tears flow freely,  
Joy comes with the morning.

"Count yourself blessed every time someone cuts you down or throws you out, every time someone smears or blackens your name to discredit me. What it means is that the truth is too close for comfort and that that person is uncomfortable. You can be glad when that happens...for even though they don't like it, I do...and all heaven applauds. And know that you are in good company; my preachers and witnesses have always been treated like this.

"But it's trouble ahead if you think you have it made;  
What you have is all you'll ever get.  
And it's trouble ahead if you're satisfied with yourself.  
Your *self* will not satisfy you for long.  
And it's trouble ahead if you think life is all fun and games.  
There's suffering to be met, and you're going to meet it.

"There's trouble ahead when you live only for the approval of others, saying what flatters them, doing what indulges them. Popularity contests are not truth contests...your task is to be true, not popular.

"To you who are ready for the truth, I say this: Love your enemies. Let them bring out the best in you, not the worst" (Luke 6: 20 -27).
